✠ Today's feast was established in Liège, France, and it extended to the whole Western Church in 1264. On the feast of **Corpus Christi** ('Christ's Body') we celebrate Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. As Pope Francis teaches, the *Corpus Christi* procession should honour Christ's gift of himself in the Eucharist, but should also be a pledge to share bread and faith with the people of the cities and towns where the processions take place. Just as the 'breaking of the bread' became a hallmark of the early Christian community, giving oneself in order to nourish others spiritually and physically should be a sign of Christians today.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.
